Skill Level : Advanced Beginner

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Supplies

Fabric 1 : 32 pieces of 4" (10.2cm) squares

Fabric 2 : 1/2 yard of cotton quilting fabric <https://tidd.ly/3lqhm36>

Notes:

-the yardage requirements are an estimate based on 44" wide cotton quilting fabric

Insulated batting 34 1/2" x 15" (88 x 38 cm) <https://amzn.to/3fthaXg>

Cotton batting 34 1/2" x 7 1/2" (88 x 19 cm) <https://amzn.to/3rjQ5bw>

Cotton thread <https://amzn.to/3SNlf5K>

If opt for premade bias tape :

3 yard of 1" single fold or 1/2" double fold bias tape (100% cotton)

Tools

Basic sewing and quilting notions

1/4" presser foot

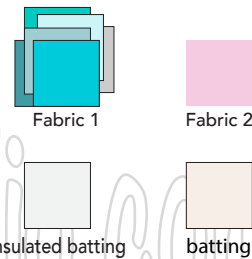
Walking foot

Machine quilting needle

Basting pins

Finished oven mitts measurements :
approx. 34 1/2" x 7 1/2" (88 x 19 cm)

Cutting & making the patchwork

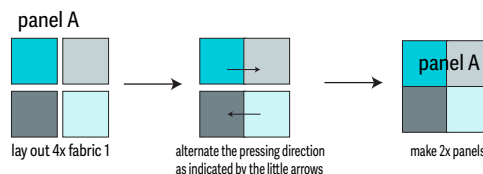
Hand pockets

Panel A : 8x fabric 1

Panel B : 2 x 7 1/2" (5 x 19 cm) cut 2x from fabric 2

Panel C : 9" x 7 1/2" (23 x 19 cm) cut 2x from fabric 2

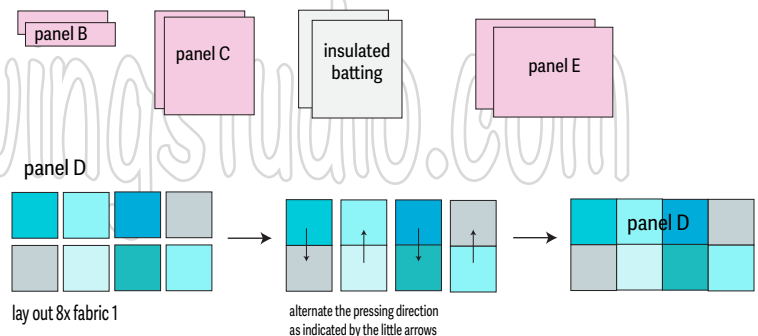
Insulated batting : 9" x 7 1/2" (23 x 19 cm) cut 2x from fabric 2



Front

Panel D : 8x fabric 1

Panel E : 10 1/2" x 7 1/2" (27 x 19 cm) cut 2x from fabric 2



Back

Panel F : 16x fabric 1

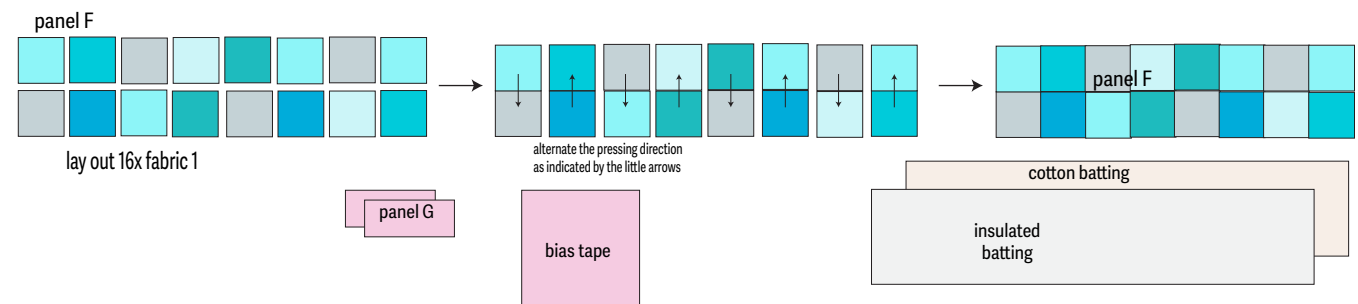
Panel G : 3 1/2" x 7 1/2" (9 x 19 cm) cut 2x from fabric 2

Insulated batting : 34 1/2" x 7 1/2" (88 x 19 cm)

Cotton batting : 34 1/2" x 7 1/2" (88 x 19 cm)

If making your own bias tape :

cut a 16" x 16" (40.5 x 40.5 cm) square ;on straight grain

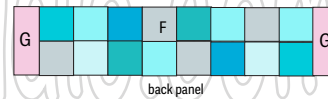
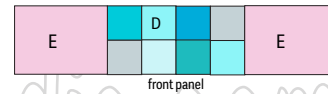
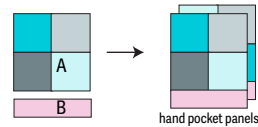


Directions

Use scant 1/4" (6mm) seam allowance when sewing the patchwork.

Please watch the full video tutorial for thorough demonstration.

1. Following the diagram on page 1, sew the patchwork panels (panel A, D, & F)
2. Sew panel A & B together to create the hand pocket panels.
3. Sew Panel E to the short sides of panel D to create the front panels.
4. Sew panel G to the short sides of panel F to create the back panels
5. Layer the back panel + insulated batting + cotton batting + front panel.
Baste, then quilt as desired.
6. Layer the back pocket panel + insulated batting + front pocket panel.
Baste, then quilt as desired.
7. Using a small circle object (e.g. mug, bowl, etc), create soft curve on each corner of the main panel, and the bottom corners of the hand pocket panels.
8. Make the bias tape.
- Note: Feel free to use premade bias tape instead (make sure the material is 100% cotton).
9. Bind the top edges of the hand pocket panels.
10. Position the hand pocket panels on both sides of the main panel, clip to secure them in place.
11. Finish the oven mitts with binding.
