

Double Square in a Square Quilt Project

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Finished quilt measurements : 57 1/2" x 66"

You will need :

7x 1/2 yard of fabric <https://tidd.ly/39UVqO1>

(3 dark tone, 2 medium tone, 2 light tone, recommended).

63" x 72" batting <https://amzn.to/3uoJkpl>

3 1/2 yard backing fabric

5/8 yard border fabric

1/2 yard binding fabric


Note: yardage requirements are estimated, based on standard 44" wide cotton quilting fabric.

To make the most out of your fabrics, please follow the cutting instructions given in the video tutorial.

Basic sewing /quilting notions

Seam allowances are 1/4" (6mm)



Cutting

Panel 1 | Cut 6x each from fabric A-G : 3 1/2" x 9" (9 x 23cm) rectangles

Panel 2 | Cut 6x each from fabric A-G : 3 1/2" x 5" (9 x 12.6cm) rectangles

Panel 3 | Cut 6x each from fabric A-G : 1 1/2" x 9" (3.8 x 23cm) rectangles

Panel 4 | Cut 6x each from fabric A-G : 1 1/2" x 5" (3.8 x 12.6cm) rectangles

Panel 5 | Cut 12x each from fabric A-G : 1" x 5" (2.5 x 12.6 cm) rectangles

Panel 6 | Cut 12x each from fabric A-G : 1" x 4" (2.5 x 10cm) rectangles

Panel 7 | Cut 6x each from fabric A-G : 4" x 4" (10 x 10 cm) squares

Border 1 | Cut 2x from the border fabric : 3 1/2" x 51 1/2" (9 x 132cm)

Border 2 | Cut 2x from the border fabric : 3 1/2" x 66" (9 x 169.4cm)

Binding strips | Cut (7x) 2 1/2" (6.5cm) strips from the width of fabric



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
Making the blocks

Seam allowances are 1/4" (6mm)

Following the below diagram, make in total of 42x blocks. Press as indicated by little arrows. Finished block should measure 9" x 9".



Note : Panel 1,2,3,4, should be the same fabric; panel 5, 6 should be the same fabric.


Assembly

1. Lay out your blocks in 7 rows, each row should have 6 blocks. Randomly alternate the direction of each block.
2. Sew the blocks one row at the time, alternate the pressing direction of each row.
3. Sew all the rows together, press towards one side.
4. Sew border 1 (short border), press towards border 1.
5. Sew border 2 (long border), press towards border 2.


Finishing

Layer with batting and backing fabric, baste, then quilt and bind as desired.


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double square in a square quilt - lay out
